



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

October 13, 2020

The Town of Didsbury Council held the Regular Council Meeting on Tuesday, October 13, 2020 in Council Chambers. Four (4) members of the public including the press and delegation were in attendance.

- Sgt. Fournier from the Didsbury RCMP Detachment presented a report on policing activities from January 1 to the end of September 2020.
- Council approved the Parkland Regional Library System 2021 per capita requisition in the amount of \$8.55 demonstrating a zero increase in the requisitions from 2020.
- Council approved to maintain the ATCO Natural Gas Franchise Fee at 25%, and the FORTIS Franchise Fee at 17%, which are both a zero percent increase from 2020.
- Council approved the purchase of a replacement truck, plow and salt/sand hopper for a maximum of \$107,500 to be allocated from the Vehicle & Equipment replacement reserve.
- Due to the current pandemic situation, the CP Rail Holiday Train will not be running this holiday season. Instead CP Rail are planning a virtual concert with donations going to local food banks. Mayor Hunter will send a letter on behalf of Council, expressing our appreciation for this much needed event and the benefits to food banks in our Nation and looking forward to the return of the Holiday Train in 2021.

The next Regular Council Meeting will be October 27, 2020 immediately following the Organizational Meeting which starts at 6:00 p.m. at the Town of Didsbury Council Chambers 1606 – 14 Street.
