

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

April 12, 2022

The Town of Didsbury Council held a Regular Council Meeting on Tuesday April 12, 2022, in Council Chambers, 1606 – 14 Street.

- BDO Canada LLP presented the 2021 Audited Financial Statements, and reported that it was a clean audit.
- The Didsbury Car Club was pleased to inform Council that they are holding their Fuel-A-Palooza event on May 6 to 7, 2022. Council approved the Temporary Road Closures, and made a motion approving the temporary road closures for this event over the Mother's Day weekend until 2025.
- Council endorsed the Town of Didsbury to participate in the provincial Communities in Bloom (CIB) program. The Town will be participating in the Friends: Evaluated category in 2022, a non-competitive stream as a great way to ease back into the CIB program without the pressure of competition in the inaugural year. Projects that are planned for our 2022 evaluation include:
 - o Landscaping improvements at the Welcome to Didsbury sign at the east entrance to town
 - The Didsbees Sanctuary project, funded by the TD Friends of the Environment grant, that will see bee hives installed safety into our community this June
 - o Location of community garden beds within the community
 - o Enhanced flower beds, baskets and barrels within the community
- Council approved the 21st Street Revitalization Project and awarded the tender to Ruby Rocky Asphalt Ltd. 21st Street is a high traffic commercial district access route in poor condition with aged deep utilities and an undersized water main.
